Ms. Krikawa has twenty-five years of experience in project management, architecture, urban design, and planning, focused on transportation and public involvement. A registered architect and LEED Accredited Professional, Jeanne sat on Seattle's Planning Commission, Landmarks Board, and Design Review Board, bringing a strong understanding of planning, urban design and the relationship between public and private environments. She joined The Underhill Company in 2002.

Representative Projects

- **Sound Transit, Central Link Light Rail.**
 - For Arai/Jackson Architects and Planners Jeanne was the project architect for the Rainier Valley and Capitol Hill conceptual station designs, coordinating with the project team on alignment configuration and location options as well as station and associated urban design necessary to complete EIS documentation.
 - With Sound Transit, Jeanne managed project development for the light rail route between the University District and Northgate, working with affected communities and partner agencies (City of Seattle, WSDOT, and King County Metro) to resolve difficult tradeoffs regarding station locations and impacts. She coordinated Section 106 federal requirements including archaeology, tribal, and historic project impacts.

- **City of Seattle, Southeast Transportation Study.**
 - As Project Manager, Jeanne worked with City staff and five subconsultants to develop over seventy projects, along with program and policy recommendations, designed to maximize the light rail investment in southeast Seattle and to support Seattle's broad goals and initiatives in areas of livability, sustainability, climate change and race and social justice. Jeanne developed and implemented a successful public involvement strategy for the most diverse communities in Seattle. Recommendations are currently being implemented.

- **Oregon State DOT, Oregon-Washington I-5 Columbia River Crossing Project.**
 - Underhill worked on a team consulting to ODOT to develop parameters for a replacement bridge or bridges for vehicles and transit. Jeanne acted as the public involvement and communications representative for ODOT.

- **City of Seattle DPD, Third Avenue Phase II Urban Design.**
 - Consulting to Bumgardner Architects, Jeanne managed the consultant team, design analysis and recommendations for Third Avenue focusing on the pedestrian environment and enhancements related to proposed transit and traffic improvements now being evaluated by SDOT and King County Metro.

- **Stuart Foundation, Washington Representative.**
 - The Stuart Foundation provides grants to support young people to become self-sustaining, responsible, and contributing members of their communities. The foundation, located in California, contracted with Jeanne to provide a local connection to community organizations, agencies, and other philanthropic interests. Jeanne focused on education opportunities for young people, particularly in Southeast Seattle and South King County and is currently working with a non-profit organization on a community-building project.

- In Vancouver, Canada, Jeanne worked on the Underhill team reviewing TransLink's Ten-Year Plan, and Vancouver City Council's Independent Review of the Richmond-Airport-Vancouver Rapid Transit Project.

- For the Washington Traffic Safety Commission and Harborview, Jeanne worked with the South County Improvements for Pedestrians Project helping communities in South King County identify physical improvements needed for pedestrian safety. A series of workshops with local jurisdictions and stakeholders identified key locations; improvements developed were incorporated into Transportation Improvement Bond applications. Jeanne also educated students in local schools on pedestrian improvements and pedestrian safety.
- Jeanne was the Community Relations Consultant for High Point Revitalization Phase II Infrastructure, developing implementing a community involvement program for High Point Phase II. She conducted public meetings and developed and implemented a communications strategy. She established a construction phone line and prepared all graphic communication materials.
- Jeanne provided planning services to seven Seattle neighborhoods during Neighborhood Planning. She developed and implemented outreach strategies, sponsored workshops and facilitated community meetings.
- With Underhill, Jeanne developed a project work plan for the Ballard to University District Corridor Transit Project, with a goal of improving transit speed and reliability through this very high ridership corridor.
