1. Why do you want to become a member of the Seattle Youth Commission? They aren't equipped to deal with a kid who is rowdy and disruptive in class because they came to school hungry. This is what I am the most passionate about. I am passionate about kids having equal access to resources, opportunities, and kindness.

3. What are your greatest strengths, and in what areas would you like to improve? Three words that I would use to describe myself are compassionate, involved, and open-minded. Those three words are my greatest strengths. I am compassionate because I feel for others and I care genuinely and deeply about the people around me.
