I am currently in Boy Scout Troop 166 but will be getting my Eagle and graduating out of the Troop when I turn 18 in July. I am also working part time at Reckless Video store.

1. Why do you want to become a member of the Seattle Youth Commission? I have a great interest in politics and government and would like to become more involved. Beyond just interest I believe that it is the job of every citizen of self governing nation to be informed and involved as much as possible in the democratic process. I am also considering further career opportunities within the realm of government and politics and this sounds like a great chance to not only make a difference in the local community, but to gain valuable experience and knowledge about how are government system works from a practical standpoint.

2. What issues are you passionate about in your community, and why? There are several issues that I care about in my community. I will detail them in no particular order. I care very much about education and the state of the education system in this country. In terms of importance education is huge. It determines the future of our country and how well we raise younger generations directly reflects on us. Education is doubly important in self government. Not only is it good for the individual, but for the society as a whole. Democracy requires a large body of informed, intelligent voters to function properly. Another local issue I care a lot about is public transportation. We, as a city, are doing very well in this regard but I think the chance to expand our bus and train system should always be taken. It makes no sense that so many people drive individual vehicles to the same place at the same time every day. This ties into another issue: pollution. I really like living in the city but there are things that I don't like about it. Though here in Seattle we are blessed to have near constant rain to keep smog away it does little or nothing to stop other types of pollution. Noise and light pollution are two that come to

mind. Both are not only annoying but are harmful to the environment and from someone who likes to star gaze, saddening.

3. What are your greatest strengths, and in what areas would you like to improve? I believe I have good analytical skills and the ability to judge issues from an objective standpoint. I try to approach issues and arguments with my viewpoint but keeping in mind that it is one of many and is quite possibly wrong. Whenever I see a story I try to find at least two different viewpoints and never believe something without good reason to do so. These practices and skills can make me seem overly clinical or make it seem like I am just being contrarian or that I don't hold consistent viewpoints. I am striving to make my viewpoints steady, but not unchanging. I'm also always trying to improve how to how defend them and how to look at them.

4. As a Youth Commissioner, you'll spend a lot of time working in groups. What's your most comfortable role in a group? I fall into different places in a group depending on the people who are in that group. At school I often assume a leadership position. In my class at school I am the one who is more inclined to lead then the others. I also often fall into an advisory or mediator role because I tend to be much more well read then a lot of my friends and more calm or rational about issues. I expect this will change as a youth commissioner since I would expect the majority of the people there to be more informed and interested in the political process then my normal peers. I always try to choose a role that will benefit the group the most and I am sure my moderation and advisory roles will be useful.
