You need to push the envelope - ask people to help you, ask them to do stuff they are not comfortable doing, do things that aren't really considered the role of a high school kid. I also learned how to map out a project so that it is successful: setting timelines that are realistic, but push you to keep on your toes, creating attainable goals, but ones that you have to really try for, and networking with people so they can refer you to other people who

you can further network with. This year I would like to complete some of my projects, and gain experience not only starting projects, but expanding them and making them sustainable so that they can continue once I am no longer in seattle

6a. In what activities do you expect to participate next year, and how will you make the Youth Commission a priority on your schedule?
