I might not be able to make a big difference but it would be a start. Also I want to be a member of the Seattle Youth Commission because I have good ideas that the world could benefit from.

2. What issues are you passionate about in your community, and why? There are quite a number of issues in our community that I am passionate about in our community. One of the main issues for me is schools. Schools need more funding for lots of things. There are lots of buildings that are falling apart, a run-down building can lower student moral and therefor achievement. Also lots of the text books are out dated so some of the information is wrong, and they are falling apart, this makes it harder for students to learn if some of what they are taught is false so they start to second guess other things they have learned as well. My mom is a writer so I'm pretty good at writing but I always would like to improve on my writing because it is a really valuable skill to have. Another area I would like to improve in is politics I have the basic idea of how it all works and what generally is going on a federal level, but on the lower, more personal, city level I don't have a great grasp of what is going on. I would like to learn about politics and I think that Seattle Youth commission is a good place to start with that.
