# City Council Request

- “The City Auditor will develop a **Logic Model** as the first step in the development of an evaluation strategy.”
- “The **Evaluation Strategy** should include an evaluation of the overall initiative and at least two of the current SYVPI program areas, with estimated costs and timeline to conduct these evaluations. It should also include a recommendation on whether to continue with the comparison city evaluation SYVPI staff was working on with the UCLA School of Public Health.”

# Methodology

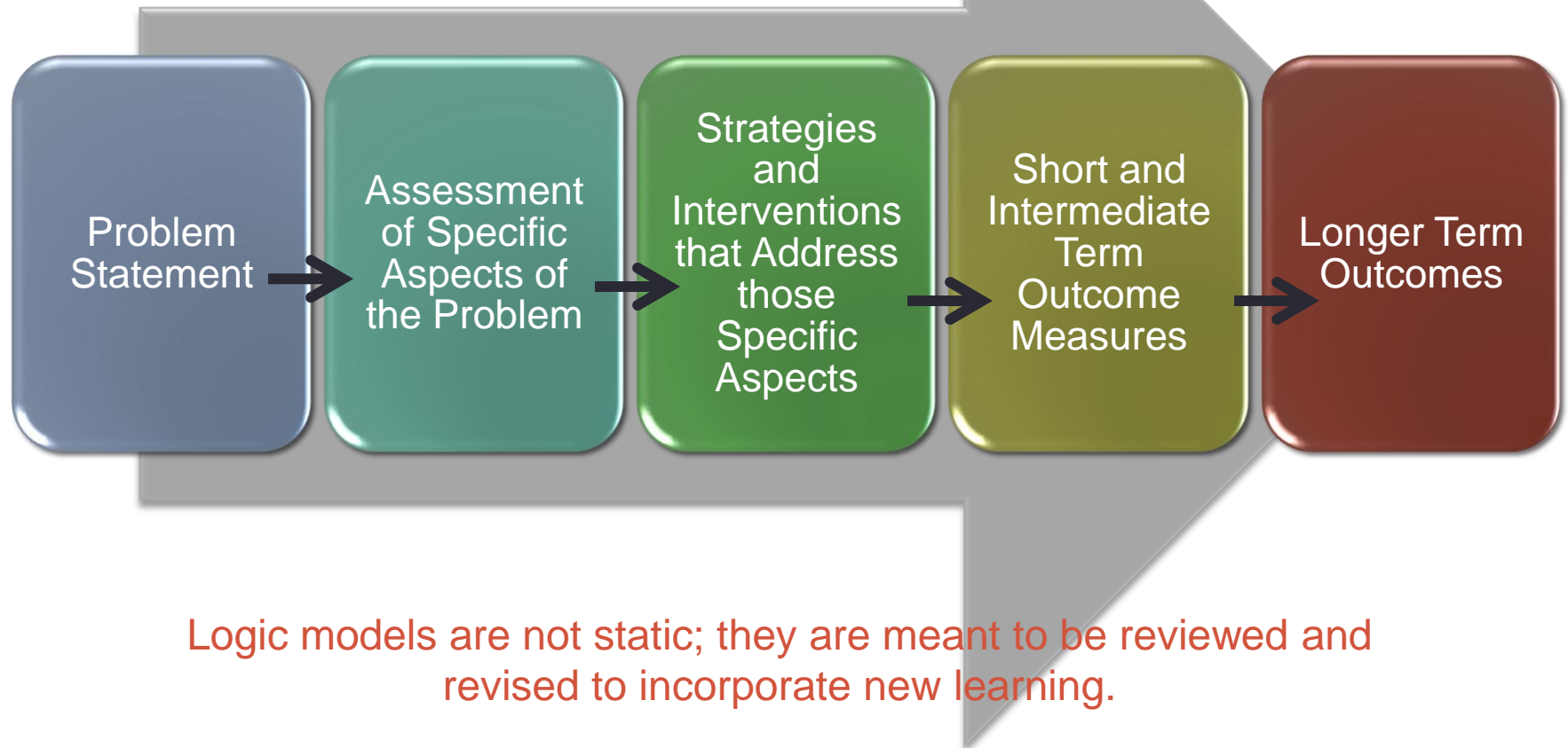
- **Collaborative Process** — SYVPI officials provided significant input on our draft report. We reviewed materials from when SYVPI was implemented as well as current program materials.
- **Technical Assistance** —
  - **Edward Banks, Ph.D.**, Senior Policy Advisor, Bureau of Justice Assistance, US Department of Justice
  - **Michelle Arciaga Young**, Senior Research Associate, National Gang Center, provided through Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, US Department of Justice
- **Other Jurisdictions** — We reviewed materials from over 20 violence prevention initiatives and met with officials from Tacoma and King County regarding their youth violence prevention efforts.

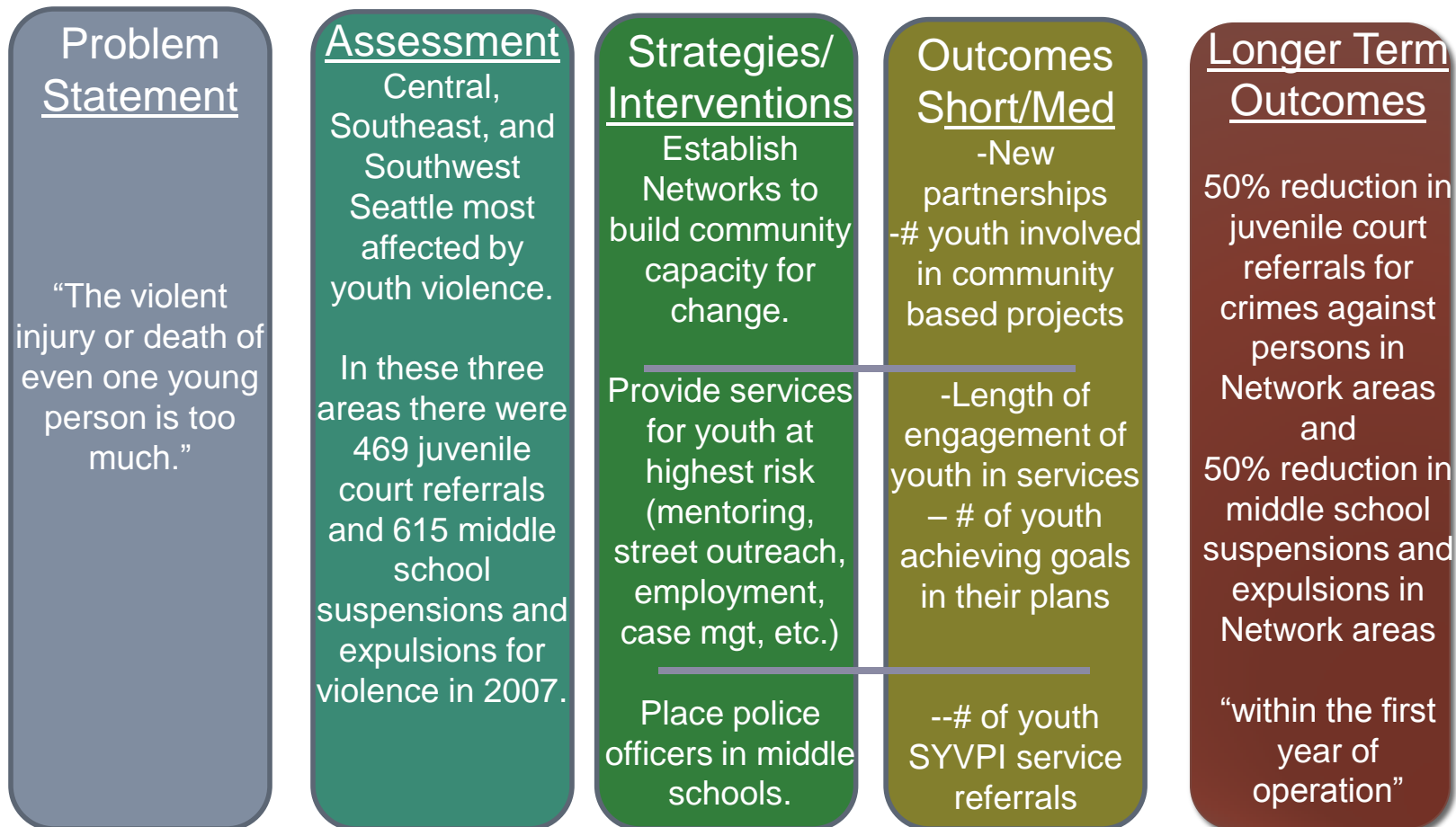
# Logic Models

# SYVPI Logic Model

SYVPI was developed without a logic model; we constructed this one in working sessions with SYVPI staff and based on SYVPI planning materials and contracts.



# Questions Raised

Our report raises 13 questions about SYVPI. They basically fall into two categories:

- **Is the SYVPI program design sound?**
- **Does SYVPI track the right information to know whether it is effective?**

# Proposed 2013 Evaluation Strategy

Overall Initiative

<b>1. Evaluation Readiness Review</b>	City Auditor and Research Partner	Up to 9 months from contract	\$125,000
<b>2. Street Outreach</b>	City Auditor and Research Partner plus technical assistance from National Gang Center	9-12 months from contract	\$ 75,000
<b>3. School Emphasis Officers</b>	City Auditor and Research Partner	9-12 months from contract	\$100,000
