This funding supports the cost of increased boater education and enforcement efforts by SPD's Harbor Unit. This unit conducts supplemental water patrols and vessel inspections to enforce life jacket requirements, provide mandatory boater education, and enforce regulations related to boating under the influence. The term of this grant runs from April 1, 2014 to September 30, 2011. There are no matching requirements or capital improvement projects associated with this item.</p>

Dear Council President Burgess,

I am pleased to transmit the attached proposed Council Bill, which accepts grants and private funds from various agencies and organizations. Corresponding appropriations for items in this Bill are included in the City Budget Office's 2014 Second Quarter Supplemental Ordinance, which is being transmitted to the Council under separate cover.

This Bill accepts 10 grants or private funds from 9 agencies or organizations totaling approximately \$2.1 million on behalf of five City departments: the Executive Department, Seattle Police Department, Department of Parks and Recreation, and Seattle Department of Transportation and the Department of Planning and Development. One of the highlights in this package is a \$500,000 grant from the Washington State Community Energy Efficiency program to reduce carbon emissions from residential buildings by providing energy efficiency improvements to Seattle residents with oil-heated homes. This Council Bill also includes \$600,000 in grants from the Puget Sound Regional Council for design work for curb ramps within the Pioneer Square and International District and a protected bicycle lane along Seventh Avenue.

Funding received from the grants and private donations that are accepted by this legislation will help provide important programs and services throughout Seattle and support City departments in their ongoing efforts to serve the public.
