Grace Kim is a founding principal of Schemata Workshop and has been practicing architecture in Illinois, Washington, and Oregon for almost two decades. Grace is a consensus builder, helping her clients and project stakeholders envision how a completed project will be experienced. She is a compassionate listener and sensitive designer, paying attention to both the present and future needs of her clients. Grace firmly believes in collaboration, and she is able to bring together disparate parties and initiate a synergy that produces innovative results. Her clients truly enjoy working with her.

Grace has been actively involved in the affordable housing arena for the past decade. She has been a speaker at the Housing Washington Conference and led the affordable housing advocacy work on behalf of the Cohousing Association of the U.S. She is a nationally recognized leader in housing and was the focus of an article on client satisfaction for Architect Magazine.

Grace is a regional expert in cohousing. She served on the national board of Cohousing Association of the US for four years. Grace also received a traveling fellowship from the University of Washington which she spent in Denmark documenting the Common House. She has an international reputation for her research and book on Common House Design and has lectured at numerous conferences.

Grace has also been actively involved nationally with intern issues since attending the Summit on Architectural Internship in 1999. She served on the Collateral Internship Task Force and the AIA Mentorship Task Group that produced the website Mentorship: A Journey in Collaborative Learning. She facilitates a mentor group in Seattle called the Laddership, which meets monthly to discuss practice and design issues that are of interest to the group. Grace served as a Washington State IDP Coordinator for two years and is also the author of A Survival Guide for Architectural Interns and Career Development (John Wiley Inc., 2006).

In 2004, Grace was the first recipient of the Emerging Professionals Mentorship Award by the NAC/YAF and in 2008 was awarded the AIA National Young Architects Award. In 2009, Schemata Workshop was awarded the City of Seattle Mayor's Small Business Award.
