I am excited for this opportunity to join the Immigrant and Refugee Commission. I am seeking to work with other leaders and stakeholders in the community to provide better opportunities for our immigrant and refugee families. I believe that the OIRA and the Commission have demonstrated a dedication to creating neighborhoods and communities of opportunity, where low-income families can realize their dreams and experience intergenerational success. I share this vision, and I would love to be part of the discourse shaping how our City supports our diverse communities.

I have a strong background working in immigrant and refugee communities domestically and internationally. My professional experiences include working with East African and Asian-Pacific Islander immigrant and refugee populations in the US as well as Burmese ethnic communities in Thailand. Prior to graduate school at the University of Washington, I developed and implemented an educational program for 60 Karen and Karenni refugee students from Burma. After the US opened its doors to more refugee arrivals, I counseled these youth and their families through the resettlement process. As a graduate assistant, I researched and analyzed economic outcomes for immigrant and refugee populations and presented a policy report to improve financial access for these communities to the nonprofit Strategies to Eliminate Poverty. For my MPA capstone project, I conducted an organizational assessment for my client, East African Community Services (EACS). My recommendations emphasized the importance of understanding the connection between community impact and EACS's services through the collection and analysis of program data. Currently I work at InterIm Community Development Association, developing an asset-building program for residents in our affordable housing properties.

Through my work both in the US and abroad, I have demonstrated a commitment to addressing inequities in local and global communities. I am excited for this chance to serve our immigrant and refugee families better by being a conduit for communication and collaboration among policymakers, service providers, and affected communities.
