**Chris E. Rivera, President & Chief Executive Officer,
Washington Biotechnology & Biomedical Association**



WBBA President since January, 2009, Chris Rivera has developed the organization's strategic direction to support the growth of life sciences in Washington state, one of Washington state's largest and fastest growing economic industries. Since Mr. Rivera took over leadership at the WBBA, the organization has mentored nearly 250 new life science start-up companies, facilitated hundreds of one-on-one meetings between WBBA members and potential investors and partners, and also co-founded WINGS – Washington's Medical Technology angel network. Combined, these efforts have directly led to the import of significant investment and collaboration from outside of Washington.

Since 2009, Mr. Rivera has also been appointed to several leadership positions, including; the Governor's Higher Education Task Force, the Washington Global Health Funding Commission, and was Chairman for the national Council of State Bioscience Associations. He was appointed to Governor elect, Jay Inslee's Transition Committee, and was appointed by the Mayor and City Council to Seattle's first Economic Development Commission.

Prior to the WBBA, Mr. Rivera spent more than 25 years in numerous leadership roles in the biotechnology industry, including Founder and CEO of Hyperion Therapeutics, as well as SVP at Tercica and Genzyme, amongst other leadership positions in the life science industry. He holds a master's degree from the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center; a bachelor degree from Northwestern Oklahoma State University; and studied marketing and management at the Albers Graduate School of Business and Economics at Seattle University.
