SELECTED CONGRESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

Harbor Maintenance Tax

Worked with Congressman McDermott, the Ports of Seattle and Tacoma and House, Senate and Ways and Means legislative staff on several versions of a revised harbor maintenance tax bill that would eliminate the land-boarder loophole and expand acceptable expenditures of the harbor maintenance trust fund. Currently a \$109 tax is imposed on each container of imports creating a dis-incentive to U.S. maritime ports of entry. The latest bill would extend the tax to imports entering the US via ship or rail and allow additional maintenance and infrastructure investments.

Climate and Environmental Action

Developed Congressman McDermott's environmental agenda and coordinated with legislative staff at the Capitol in drafting legislation. Worked with national and local environmental and community groups in developing legislation and promoting the Congressman's efforts.

Legislation and action included the True Cost of Coal Act, Salmon Solutions and Planning Act and the Managed Carbon Price Act. Led many of the Congressman's collaborative efforts with State and local government officials, constituents, environmental and business groups.

International Trade Agreements

Supported Congressman McDermott's nuanced position on free and fair trade. I worked in an often contentious environment between both supporters and opponents of the Korea, Panama and Colombia Free Trade Agreements and was his primary liaison to groups including the Fair Trade Coalition, Washington Council on International Trade, the Seattle Chamber of Commerce and the Trade Development Alliance and others in support the Congressman's position on the agreements. Facilitated local testimony supporting his position to the Ways and Means Subcommittee on Trade.

Indonesian Trade Dispute

Supported Congressman McDermott's work as Ranking Member of Ways and Means Subcommittee for Trade by facilitating a meeting in Seattle between the Indonesian Ambassador and Washington State tree fruit growers and agricultural exporters. Indonesia closed its ports to many U.S. agricultural goods and is in a dispute resolution process with the World Trade

Organization. The meeting was the first time the Ambassador had met directly with local growers to discuss their concerns and demonstrate willingness to work to resolve their concerns

Seattle Seawall Reconstruction

Worked with Senate counterparts in discussions between the City of Seattle and Army Corps of Engineers to be sure both sides had an open dialogue with clear expectations. Unsuccessfully attempted to reconcile the Corps project timeline with the City's construction deadlines in an effort to minimize cost and local impacts.

Howard Hanson Dam; Disaster Prevention and Mitigation

Lead Congressman Inslee's successful efforts to secure disaster mitigation and dam reconstruction funding. Worked with Army Corps of Engineers to identify solutions to potential cataclysmic failure of earthen dam on the Green River, kept the Congressman appraised and advocated for legislative fix. Worked directly with the Congressional Delegation, local, county and state elected officials from the Green River valley to Seattle.
