

**Charissa Raynor, Executive Director of SEIU Healthcare NW Training Partnership/ SEIU Healthcare NW Health Benefits Trust**

Charissa is Executive Director of the SEIU Healthcare NW Training Partnership and Health Benefits Trust headquartered in Seattle, Washington. The Training Partnership is the largest nonprofit school of its kind in the nation providing training and workforce development services to more than 43,000 long-term care workers annually while the Health Benefits Trust provides smartly designed healthcare coverage and wellness supports to nearly 15,000 of these workers. Both organizations are sponsored by a labor management partnership including SEIU, the State of Washington, and twenty leading home care service agencies. Charissa provides overall leadership and strategic direction to these two inter-related non-profit organizations building on more than a decade of experience working at the intersection of healthcare and workforce development. Charissa holds a Master's in Health Services Administration from George Washington University and is a Registered Nurse with experience in public health, long-term care, and primary care settings. She is a member of the Washington Health Alliance board of directors and the U.S. Secretary of Labor's Advisory Committee on Apprenticeship
