He is a founding board member of the African American Museum in Seattle and in 2008 he became the Founding Director of the Umoja PEACE Center.  In 2014 he received the Center for Ethical Leadership Legacy Leadership Award. He is also a recipient of the Martin Luther King County Executive Pioneer Award for Excellence in Hip-Hop and a past fellow with national green advocacy organization, Green For All.
