

Lili has seven years of working experience in restoration ecology specializing in wetlands. She holds certificates in Nearshore Restoration as well as Watershed Stewardship from Washington State University, Designing Compensatory Mitigation and Restoration Projects from the Washington Coastal Training Program, and a certificate in Wetland Science and Management from the University of Washington. She has extensive experience in volunteer management, upland and wetland restoration, prescribed burning, and trail building. Recently she graduated from the National Hispana Leadership Institute's (NHLI) Advancing Latina Leaders in Non-Profit (ALL-IN) program. Through her fellowship with NHLI she also received a certificate in Non-Profit Management from Georgetown University. Lili is a proud Chicana and is passionate about social justice issues and working in solidarity to empower communities that have historically been marginalized. Lili volunteers her time with an organization called Powerful Voices to encourage positive girl culture and the growth of strong girls into strong women.
