COUNCIL BILL 1182168

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4 AN ORDINANCE relating to the solid waste system of Seattle Public Utilities; revising rates
5 and charges for solid waste services; revising credits to low income customers for solid
6 waste services; and amending Chapters 21.40 and 21.76 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

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8 WHEREAS, Ordinance 124056 adopted solid waste rates for 2013 through 2016 and provided
9 for an evaluation of projected 2015 and 2016 Solid Waste Fund financial performance in
10 mid-2014; and

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12 WHEREAS, Ordinance 124056 allowed the City Council to increase 2015 and 2016 solid waste
13 rates if the evaluation indicated that the Solid Waste Fund would not meet its financial
14 policy targets in 2015 and 2016, or reduce rates if the financial evaluation indicated that
15 such a reduction would allow the Solid Waste Fund to meet all its financial policy targets
16 in 2015 and 2016; and

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18 WHEREAS, Resolution 30695 established financial policy targets for the Solid Waste Fund; and

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20 WHEREAS, Resolution 31516, adopted in April 2014, strengthened the Solid Waste Fund's
21 financial policies by adding an additional debt service coverage policy; and

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23 WHEREAS, the mid-2014 evaluation of Solid Waste Fund financial performance by Seattle
24 Public Utilities determined that an increase to adopted 2015 and 2016 adopted solid
25 waste rates is required to meet the additional debt service coverage requirements
26 established per Resolution 31516; and

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28 WHEREAS, strong performance against financial policy targets by the Solid Waste Fund
increases the likelihood of receiving favorable interest rates on solid waste bonds and
therefore can lower costs for debt servicing; and

WHEREAS, a portion of increased solid waste revenues collected in the rates authorized under
this ordinance will be used to pay for debt service on revenue bonds that the Solid Waste
Fund expects to issue in 2015 to fund facility upgrades; and

WHEREAS, credits for qualified low income customers should be revised when solid waste rates
change; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 21.40.050 of the Seattle Municipal Code is amended as follows:

21.40.050 Residential can rates and charges.

A. Charges for residential can garbage and rubbish collection and disposal service shall be in accordance with the following schedules:

1. All residences with curbside/alley garbage container pickup(~~(, except residences assigned to the One Less Truck Pilot Program, as set forth in subsection 21.40.050.A.12))~~): a charge per month or portion thereof, for once-a-week service for each service unit subscribed to, billed directly to the owner, homeowner association, or occupant thereof as follows:

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3 3. Multiunit residential consolidated curbside/alley garbage collection service. Multiunit
4 residences with a single combined utility account may consolidate garbage into fewer service
5 units than the number of dwelling units on the premise. Upon request, multiunit residences with
6 multiple combined utility accounts, such as townhouse complexes, may consolidate garbage
7 service if such premises share a single water irrigation meter for which a homeowners
8 association is financially responsible and agrees to be financially responsible for the combined
9 utility account, or as determined by the Director. In the event of consolidation, the total
10 consolidated service volume divided by the number of dwelling units must be at least equal to
11 the minimum equivalent service volume per unit, as determined by the Director.
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15 4. Minimum Charge, No Pickup Service. A charge per month or portion thereof of \$6.85
16 shall be billed directly to the owner, homeowners association, or occupant, of any residence not
17 subscribing to pick-up service to cover landfill closure costs, billing, collection, Low Income
18 Rate Assistance, and hazardous waste costs. To be eligible for the minimum charge (zero
19 container rate) a customer may not generate any garbage or rubbish for collection or disposal.
20 With occupied premises, the customer must demonstrate a consistent and effective practice of
21 selective purchasing to minimize refuse, of recycling materials whenever practical, and of
22 composting any yardwaste generated on the premises and the customer must have qualified for
23 the rate on or before December 31, 1988. A customer is not eligible for the zero container rate
24 by hauling his or her garbage and rubbish to a transfer station, disposal site, or by disposal in
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1 another customer's containers or by the use of prepaid stickers. Vacant dwelling units in
2 multiunit residences where each dwelling unit receives a separate combined utility bill qualify
3 for the minimum charge where the conditions of this paragraph are met. Vacant dwelling units in
4 multiunit residences with a single combined utility account do not qualify for the minimum
5 charge.

6 5. Extra Bundles. A customer may place an extra bundle with its container for regular
7 pickup. The charge will be billed directly to the owner or occupant, unless a prepaid sticker is
8 used. A prepaid sticker authorizes pickup of the bundle when placed with the customer's
9 container. The sticker must be affixed to the bundle in order for the bundle to be picked up by
10 the collector, and the customer not to be billed. The following charges will apply to each extra
11 bundle:

6. Bulky and White Goods Pickup. Charges for the pickup of bulky and white goods, as well as additional charges for items containing hazardous waste such as chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs), shall be billed as follows:

7. Curbside Electronics Recycling Pickup. Curbside electronics pickup service will be available by customer request to all residential can accounts. Each pickup of up to three electronic products set out at the curb shall be billed at \$20. The Director may establish additional conditions for electronic products eligible for pickup.

8. Curbside/Alley Compostable Waste. A collection charge for weekly service will be billed monthly directly to the owner, homeowners association, or occupant, according to the following schedule: ((

9. Mandatory Curbside/Alley Compostable Waste Service and Exemptions.

Curbside/alley compostable waste service shall be mandatory for all residential solid waste can accounts, except customers who qualify for a home composting exemption or customers with no garbage pick-up service, per the provisions of paragraph 4 of this subsection. To qualify for the home composting exemption, customers must actively compost all vegetative foodwaste on-site and agree to comply with public and environmental health guidelines and allow Seattle Public Utility representatives to evaluate their composting methods.

10. New/Changed Account. A charge of \$10 for the establishment of a new account or for each change in an existing account. This charge shall apply when the owner or property manager of any single-family residence or multifamily structure (duplex, triplex, fourplex, or structure with five or more units) establishes a new account or requests any change in his/her account requiring a change in account number or customer number. The new/changed account charge is not applicable to customers qualified for Low Income Rate Assistance.

11. Physical Disability Exemption. An exemption will be provided to qualified residents to allow for backyard collection at curbside rates when the resident is physically unable to take his or her garbage and rubbish containers to the curb. Qualifying criteria shall include, but are not limited to, the resident's physical condition, qualification for backyard service in other City programs, a physician's recommendation, the presence of other physically capable persons in the household, special topography and other unique property conditions, taking into account the contractors' ability to provide different combinations of container sizes to make curbside pickup feasible.

~~((12. Seattle Public Utilities shall conduct an One Less Truck Pilot Program (Program) for approximately 800 residences assigned to participate in the Program for six months, to be completed no later than January 31, 2013. All residences assigned to the Program shall be billed a charge per month or portion thereof, for every other week service for each service unit subscribed to, billed directly to the owner, homeowner association, or occupant effective for the six-month Program to be completed no later than January 31, 2013, as follows:~~

The SPU Director is authorized to assign approximately 800 residences to participate in the Program and assign each participating residence to either the "A" or "B" rate structure.

The SPU Director is authorized to pay a stipend of up to \$100 to each residence participating in the Program no later than two months after the end of the Program, the amount of which the SPU Director shall determine based on the rate paid by each residence during the Program.))

D. The charges imposed by subsections A1 through A4 of this section inclusive shall not apply to residences which elect to use detachable containers supplied either by the City's contractor or by the customer for the storage of garbage and rubbish. Application for detachable container service for a minimum period of six months shall be made to the Director of Seattle Public Utilities on forms supplied by him/her, and collection of garbage and rubbish from such premises shall be made at such frequency as is necessary as determined by the Director of Seattle Public Utilities, but in no event less than once each week. The monthly charges for detachable container service for the container and frequency selected shall be in accordance with the rates set forth in Section 21.40.060.

E. The Director of Seattle Public Utilities may adjust the service level to a single-family residence to match the garbage and rubbish actually collected from the premises, or, for multifamily structures, to match the amount of garbage and rubbish reasonably anticipated from the dwelling units on the premises and the customer will be responsible for the appropriate charges for the adjusted service level in accordance with this section.

Section 2. Section 21.40.060 of the Seattle Municipal Code is amended as follows:

21.40.060 Residential detachable container rates and charges.

Compostable waste bag rates for pre-paid bag service shall be 32 percent less than the corresponding rates above for garbage service. Recycling bags shall be provided free of charge.

Yardwaste shall not be mixed with garbage, refuse or rubbish for disposal.

Bags set out for collection that are not pre-paid shall be charged at the rate for extra bundles, per subsection H of this section.

1 E. Mixed-use Building. The Director of Seattle Public Utilities will determine the
 2 appropriate residential collection service level for a mixed-use building according to the
 3 estimated amount of residential garbage or refuse generated and to be collected by the City.

4 F. Charges for Lockable Containers. Customers using detachable containers (compacted
 5 or noncompacted) may have a lock installed by the collection contractors, subject to the
 6 following charges. Only customers who own their own containers may install their own locks.

J. Curbside Electronics Recycling Pickup. Curbside electronics pickup service will be available by customer request to residential detachable container accounts, with approval by the applicable solid waste account owner or designee. Each pickup of up to three electronic products set out at the curb shall be billed at \$20. The Director may establish additional conditions for electronic products eligible for pickup.

K. Residential detachable container customers who are not required to subscribe to pre-paid bag garbage service have the option to subscribe to either residential can curbside/alley compostable waste collection service per the terms of SMC 21.40.050.A.8 or commercial compostable waste collection service per the terms of SMC 21.40.070. Customers who are required to subscribe to pre-paid bag garbage service have the option to subscribe to either one or more residential can curbside/alley compostable waste collection services per the terms of SMC 21.40.050.A.8 or pre-paid bag compostable waste collection service per the terms of SMC 21.40.060.D. Detachable container customers are not subject to the provisions of SMC 21.40.050.A.9, which requires mandatory curbside/alley compostable waste service as of March 30, 2009. It shall be mandatory for all residential detachable container customer accounts to subscribe to one of the compostable waste services described in this subsection, except in the following circumstances:

1 1. Existing Structures: Existing residential structures that do not have adequate storage

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to the solid waste system of Seattle Public Utilities; revising rates and charges for solid waste services; revising credits to low income customers for solid waste services; and amending Chapters 21.40, 21.76 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

Summary of the Legislation:

This proposed ordinance would adjust solid waste rates for residential and commercial customers for 2015 and 2016 based upon the adjustment mechanism outlined in Ordinance 124056, and change the low-income assistance credits for solid waste customers.

Background:

The Council in November of 2012 adopted solid waste rates for 2013-2016 and provided a mid-term adjustment mechanism to modify rates if the Solid Waste Fund was not expected to meet its financial policy targets. Earlier this year the Council passed Resolution 31516 to help preserve the Solid Waste Fund's favorable bond rating by introducing a new debt service coverage policy. This ordinance would increase the scheduled solid waste rate increase in 2015 by 1.6% to 5.9% to meet this new debt service coverage policy. The previously scheduled 2016 rate increase of 3.4% will remain, though 2016 rates will be higher due to an increase of the previously approved base rate in 2015.

The 2015 and 2016 revenues are the additional solid waste revenues resulting from the upward adjustment in SPU's solid waste rates compared to already-approved rates.

The Solid Waste Fund would not meet its financial policy obligations, possibly risking a rating downgrade and increasing the cost of future bond financing.

City of Seattle departments incurred roughly \$400,000 in solid waste collections costs in 2013. With the already approved 2014-2106 rate increases, those costs would increase to \$460,000 by 2016. This legislation will increase those costs by an additional \$7,000. Utility tax payments to the general fund will increase by \$279,000 in 2015 and by \$375,000 in 2016.

Not raising solid waste rates at this time would result in the Solid Waste Fund failing to meet its financial policy targets.

Dear Council President Burgess:

I am transmitting the attached proposed Council Bill that would adjust Seattle Public Utilities' solid waste rates for 2015 and 2016. The Council two years ago approved solid waste rates through 2016 which included a mid-term adjustment provision for 2015 and 2016 in the case the Solid Waste Fund (SWF) was projected to miss its financial policy targets. These proposed rate changes are necessary to meet the obligations of the new SWF debt service coverage financial policy, which was approved last April to preserve the SWF bond ratings.

The already-approved 2015 rate will increase by 1.6% to 5.9%. The 2016 rate increase will remain at 3.4%, but will now be applied to the higher 2015 rates. A typical monthly residential solid waste bill as of April 1 of each year will increase from \$40.95 in 2014 to \$43.40 in 2015 and \$44.85 in 2016. Rates at SPU's transfer stations will not change. To partially offset the impact of the rate increase, this legislation would revise credits for qualifying low-income customers.
