ORDINANCE _____
COUNCIL BILL 118277

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Urban Forestry Commission, adding a new member and amending Sections 3.72.020 and 3.72.030 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

WHEREAS, the Urban Forestry Commission was created by Ordinance 123052 in 2009; and

WHEREAS, the Commission currently does not have a young adult member as authorized by the Get Engaged Program, Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 3.51; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 3.72.020 of the Seattle Municipal Code, last amended by Ordinance 121568, is amended as follows:

A. The Commission is comprised of ((~~nine~~)) ten members:

- 1. A wildlife biologist, preferably with expertise in ornithology (Position #1);
- 2. An urban ecologist, preferably with expertise in the field of restoration ecology

(Position #2);

3. A representative of a local, state, or federal natural resource agency or an accredited university (Position #3);

4. A hydrologist or similar professional, preferably with expertise in the study of natural drainage, climate or air quality, or a combination thereof (Position #4);

5. An arborist, with one or more of the following qualifications:

a. Board Certification as a Master Arborist or Municipal Specialist from the International Society of Arboriculture; or

b. Certification by the American Society of Consulting Arborists; or

c. Background and experience in Tree Risk Assessment from a credentializing agency or a professional organization.

2 6. A landscape architect, with certification from the International Society of
3 Arboriculture (Position # 6);

4 7. A representative of a non-profit or non-governmental organization whose mission is
5 to advocate for preservation or enhancement of urban forests, wildlife habitat or similar natural
6 systems (Position #7);

7 8. A representative of either the development community, including developers,
8 builders, architects, or realtors, with experience in projects developed under Leadership in
9 Energy and Environmental Design (LEED), or a representative from a non-city utility (Position
10 #8); ~~((and,))~~

11 9. An economist, financial analyst, Washington State licensed real estate broker, or any
12 other similar professional, with expertise preferred in land use planning, environmental planning,
13 or either residential or commercial development. (Position #9)~~((-))~~; and,

14 10. A designated young adult position in accordance with Chapter 3.51. (Position #10).

16 Section 2. Section 3.72.030 of the Seattle Municipal Code, created by Ordinance
17 123052, is amended as follows:

18 All positions are numbered one through ~~((nine))~~ ten. Individuals shall be appointed
19 into those numbered positions. Members in odd numbered positions from position one to
20 position seven shall be appointed by a majority vote of the Council. Individuals in even
21 numbered positions from position two to position eight shall be appointed by the Mayor, subject
22 to confirmation by a majority vote of the City Council. Position nine shall be appointed by a
23 majority vote of the ~~((eight appointed))~~ members in positions one through eight. Position ten shall
24 be appointed in the manner provided for in section 3.51.030.~~((All nine ten positions shall be~~
25 ~~filled as soon as practicable after the Council has authorized the creation of the Commission.))~~

1 For the initial round of appointments the positions will be staggered: positions one,
2 two and nine shall serve one-year terms, positions four, five and six shall serve two-year terms
3 and positions three, seven, eight shall serve three-year terms. At the conclusion of the initial term
4 of each appointment, all subsequent terms of each position shall be for three years and the term
5 of 1/3 of the positions shall expire each year. Persons appointed to position ten shall serve for a
6 one year, non-renewable term. A commission member whose term has expired shall continue to
7 hold office until a successor has been appointed and qualified (~~by vote of the Council~~)).

8 No members shall serve more than two consecutive terms. Any vacancy for an unexpired
9 term shall be filled in the same manner as for an original appointment under this section.

10
11 Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by
12 the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it
13 shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.
