YOUTH SPEAK

Kiki's Story

Kiki entered Mercer M.S. in 6th grade with a MSP Level 1 in Math and Level 2 in Reading and Writing. Both levels are below State standard.

Kiki attended the summer learning program after 5th and 6th grade. Each summer she:

- had over 90% attendance, missing only one day
- had a min. 5pt gain on her MAP reading score

Now in 7th grade, she is at a Level 3 in Math and a high Level 2 in Reading. She is expected to meet standard in reading this year.

 - ▶ 5/6 weeks, Monday-Friday, 9:00am-3:00pm
 - ▶ 144 total program hours (*68 hrs Academic*)
 - ▶ 520 Students, 6th-8th grade
- ▶ Elementary: Northgate ES
 - ▶ 6 weeks, Monday-Thursday, 8:00am-2:00pm
 - ▶ 144 total program hours (*64 hrs Academic*)
 - ▶ 48 Students, 2nd-5th grade

 - ▶ Below State standard on MSP or not reaching typical growth on MAP
 - ▶ Not passing core courses
 - ▶ Immigrant/Refugee
 - ▶ English Language Learners

 - ▶ Mitigate summer learning loss
 - ▶ Limited access to high quality summer learning
 - ▶ Create opportunities for enriching experiences

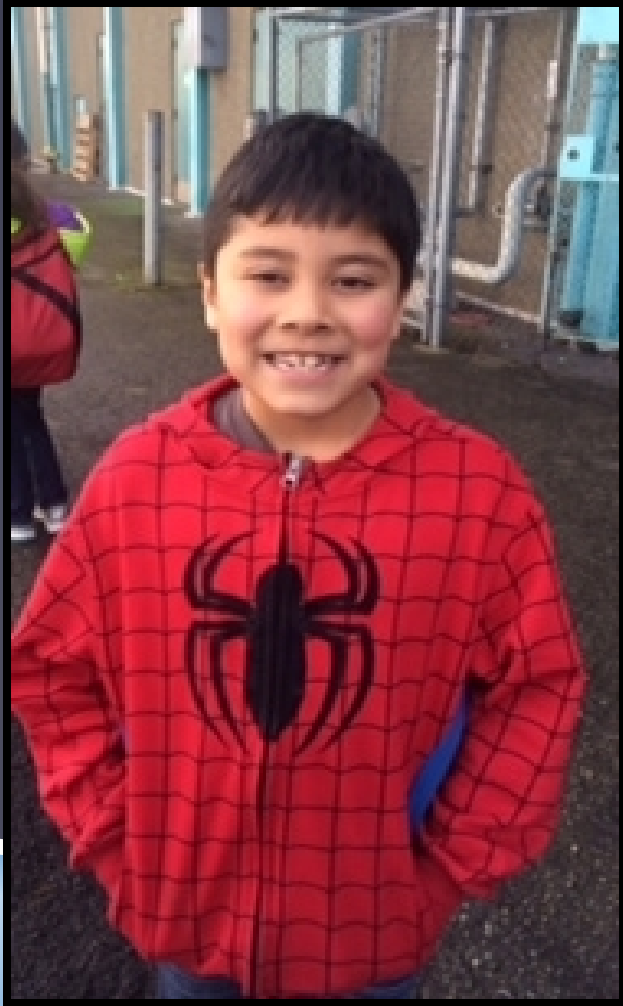
