**NOTICE OF CITY COUNCIL PUBLIC HEARING ON A BILL AUTHORIZING A LOT BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT AND EXCHANGE OF PROPERTY, ADJACENT TO THE YESLER COMMUNITY CENTER, BETWEEN THE CITY OF SEATTLE AND THE SEATTLE HOUSING AUTHORITY TO ALLOW DEDICATION OF A NEW STREET IN YESLER TERRACE**

[Council Bill \(C.B.\) 118145](#) has been proposed by the Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation (Parks). It would authorize a Lot Boundary Adjustment and exchange of property between the City of Seattle and the Seattle Housing Authority (SHA) to allow for the dedication of the new S. Washington Street in the redeveloped Yesler Terrace, a project being undertaken by SHA. The new street requires a small slice of Parks property at the south edge of the parcel on which the City-owned Yesler Community Center sits. This small slice of property would be deeded by the City to SHA in exchange for SHA deeding to the City a same-size piece of property just to the west that abuts the Community Center parcel.

City of Seattle Ordinance 118477, which adopted Initiative 42, provides the requirements and procedure for a transfer of Parks property such as is proposed here, and requires that the City Council hold a public hearing. C.B. 118145 would authorize the Lot Boundary Adjustment and exchange of property, and includes a finding that the exchange meets the requirements of Ordinance 118477.

**PUBLIC HEARING**

The City Council's Parks, Seattle Center, Libraries and Gender Pay Equity Committee will hold a public hearing on C.B. 118145 on Tuesday, July 15, 2014, in City Council Chambers, Seattle City Hall, 600 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Floor 2.
