About the Index

The Capitol Hill EcoDistrict Index is a set of metrics to track progress in 8 performance areas: Energy (E), Water (W), Transportation (T), Materials (M), Habitat (H), Culture (C), Health (L) and Equity (Q).

Targets and baselines were developed with neighborhood stakeholders, plus academic and technical experts. We also consulted with the following City departments:

OSE, DPD, DoN, SDOT, SPU, City Light, OED, OH, OAC, Seattle/KC Public Health.

Plans for 2015:

*Update each indicator to track progress.

*Review potential additions, including metrics for Culture.
