


Aidan Key

Aidan Key's work to increase understanding and awareness of gender identity in all people has taken him into places ranging from kindergarten classes to boardrooms. He has guided many schools in changing their anti-discrimination language and handbooks to not only include gender identity and expression but in real, tangible ways to implement this within the classroom curriculum. Aidan has been instrumental in the revision of Washington Intercollegiate Athletic Association's policy regarding gender identity and expression making it one of the most fair and progressive in the country. He's been active politically, and in areas of social change, for decades. He thoroughly enjoys engaging people of all ages and identities in exploring our common experiences and identifying and valuing the

differences. Through this kind of dialogue and outreach, Aidan feels that greater understanding of all elements of diversity can be achieved.

Lillie Cridland

Lillie is a Political and Communications Specialist for the Washington State Nurses Association. She is responsible for coordinating and advancing the communications and political advocacy needs of the Association. Her prior work experience includes public affairs consulting, political campaigns, work with Seattle youth, and voter education efforts. She has also served as a volunteer with Seattle Works and as the Get Engaged Commissioner for the Seattle Commission for Sexual Minorities.

Lillie got an exciting introduction to politics working on the Gore campaign in Florida during the 2000 election. Since then she has been committed to ensuring that people are informed and engaged in the political process. She is particularly interested in engaging people who are frequently invisible in government, such as LGBTQ youth.

Lillie graduated from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania in 2002 with a Bachelor's of Science in Economics.
