



The Sister Cities Coordinating Council was established in 1996, City Resolution 29456, to improve coordination among the associations, help strengthen the overall program in a way that benefits the City and the individual associations, and promote increased community recognition and visibility for the overall sister cities program. The 20 members include 10 representing the sister city associations, 2 representing the Executive and Legislature, and 8 representing the community-at-large. All members are appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council. All appointments are subject to City Council confirmation. Attached to this memorandum is the current membership roster of the Sister Cities Coordinating Council including the new appointees.

The appointments' bios for all new appointees are as follows:

Lorraine C. McConaghy is the Public Historian at the Museum of History & Industry; Lecturer, Museum Studies Graduate Program, UW; Director, Nearby History and Discovering A-Y-P; Manager, Speaking of Seattle oral history project, as well as a curator at MOHAI. Lorraine has received numerous awards and honors including Award of Merit for *Nearby History* from the American Association of State and Local History and Exhibit Award for *Essential Seattle* from the Association of King County Historical Organizations, etc.

Sandra L. Marvinney

Sandra L. Marvinney is a Senior Communications Specialist with the College of Engineering where she manages the semi-annual alumni newsletter, development materials and special publications. Sandy is an editor, writer, publications manager and designer, with broad expertise in producing publications for professional, technical and general audiences with special focus in the areas of fundraising communications, science and engineering, public health and medicine and the environment. Sandy served as the president of the Seattle-Chongqing Sister City Association for 10 years. She's on the Board of the Seattle Chinese Garden Society, Seattle International Children's Festival, and the Washington State China Relations Council.

Richard Mander

Richard Mander is the CEO of BigScreenLive, which develops a software platform that enables seniors and their families to connect through the internet. Prior to that, he was CEO and Managing Director of HumanWare of Christchurch, New Zealand, which designs and manufactures electronic devices for blind, low vision and learning disabled people. He is a board member of the Seattle-Christchurch Sister City Association.

Don Mills

Don Mills has been the president of the Seattle-Mazatlan Sister City Association since 1999. He is the owner of his own insurance business. He served as president of Seattle Life Underwriters and Vice Chair of NALU Convention in Dallas, Boston, and Seattle. Don also worked with Seafair for over 10 years.

Mike James

Mike James was a long time lead anchor in local television. He is a journalist respected by his peers and the public. He started in 1966 at KING Radio, where he wrote and anchored early morning newscasts. In 1968 Mike moved to KING-TV. Mike hosted and produced for the Seattle Channel "CityStream," a public affairs program focusing on neighborhood issues, writer interviews and public policy. He is a past-president of the Hearing, Speech, and Deafness Center Board of Directors and has also served as the 60th Anniversary Committee Chair and board president of the Seattle Youth Symphony Orchestra. Mike is the current president of the Seattle-Perugia Sister City Association.

Dan L. Peterson

Dan L. Peterson is an audit team member for OSP for multiple schools across Washington and the University Coordinator for Seattle Pacific University supervising student teachers completing their final student teaching experiences. He was Principal of

Meridian Park School in Shoreline for 4 years and Principal of Wedgwood Elementary School for 5 years. He was selected in 2004 as the regional Distinguished Principal by the East King County Principal's Association. He is also the Chair of the "Accent on Understanding" organization which promotes teacher exchanges with educators in Russia and former Soviet republics.
