COUNCIL BILL 118424

AN ORDINANCE relating to the City Light Department; declaring certain real property rights and improvements surplus to the City of Seattle's utility needs; and authorizing the release of an access easement and a permit for a groundwater observation well, and the conveyance of ownership of said groundwater well to James and Valerie Van Dyke in Pend Oreille County, Washington.

WHEREAS, Seattle City Light installed more than 40 ground water level monitoring wells in Pend Oreille County as part of the construction and licensing of the Boundary Dam in the 1950s and 1960s to study the dam reservoir's impact on ground water levels and the potential, if any, to flood local mines; and

WHEREAS, information from these monitoring wells was collected for nearly 50 years and indicated no deleterious ground water level effects, and the monitoring wells are no longer needed; and

WHEREAS, any groundwater monitoring well which is unusable, abandoned, whose use has been permanently discontinued, or is in disrepair must be properly decommissioned as required by Washington Administrative Code 173-160-381; and

WHEREAS, James and Valerie Van Dyke requested that the monitoring well on their property (Groundwater Observation Well No CS-36) not be decommissioned and agreed to take responsibility for any liabilities and regulatory responsibilities related to this well; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

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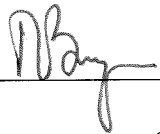

2 Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of RCW 35.94.040 and after a public hearing, the
3 real property rights acquired for a groundwater observation well, on the property legally
4 described in Attachment 1 hereto, together with the groundwater monitoring well thereon, are no
5 longer needed for the City of Seattle's utility purposes, and are declared surplus to City needs.

6 Section 2. The General Manager and Chief Executive Officer of Seattle City Light, or
7 designee, is authorized to execute for and on behalf of the City of Seattle, a Release of Easement
8 and Permit and Conveyance of Water Well Ownership substantially in the form attached hereto
9 as Attachment 1.

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Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.

The CITY OF SEATTLE, a municipal corporation of the State of Washington, acting by and through its CITY LIGHT DEPARTMENT ("Grantor"), hereby grants to JAMES AND VALERIE VAN DYKE ("Grantees"), a complete release from that Access Road Easement dated April 21, 1965, and recorded under Recording No. 115713 in Pend Oreille County, Washington, lying within that property legally described as follows:

Release of Easement Area:

The NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 9 and NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 10;
The NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ and Government Lot 2 of Section 10 and the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of
Section 3,
All in Township 39 North, Range 43 East, W.M.,
situated in Pend Oreille County, State of Washington.

TOGETHER WITH a complete release from that Permit for Groundwater Observation Wells dated July 28, 1965, and recorded under Recording No. 116817 in Pend Oreille County, Washington, lying within that property legally described as follows:

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Release of Permit Area:

Government Lot 2 of Section 10 and the SW ¼ of SE ¼ of Section 3, Township 39 North, Range 43 East, W.M., EXCEPT Mineral rights underlying, situated in Pend Oreille County, State of Washington.

GRANTOR ALSO CONVEYS AND QUITCLAIMS to Grantees all right, title or interest, whether real or personal, in the monitoring well Grantor previously constructed on Grantees' Property (Government Lot 2 of Section 10) pursuant to the Permit for Groundwater Observation Wells described above ("Monitoring Well"), SUBJECT TO Grantees' acceptance of the Monitoring Well as-is, where-is, with all faults and without any representation or warranty whatsoever, express or implied, as to its condition or its suitability or sufficiency for the Grantees' intended purposes. Grantees acknowledge that wells that are no longer used for their intended purposes must be properly decommissioned according to Washington Administrative Code Section 173-160-381 and Grantees accept full responsibility for any such decommissioning. Grantees also releases and shall indemnify, defend, and hold Grantor and its past, present and future officials, employees, and agents, harmless from and against any and all claims, demands, penalties, fees, damages, losses, expenses (including but not limited to regulatory agencies, attorneys, contractors and consultants' fees and costs), and liabilities arising out of, or in any way connected with, the Monitoring Well, it being intended that Grantees shall so indemnify Grantor and such personnel without regard to any fault or responsibility of Grantor or Grantees. The obligation to decommission the Monitoring Well and the acknowledgement, release and indemnification touch and concern Grantees' Property and are intended to run with the land and bind Grantee and Grantee's heirs, successors and assigns, and inure to the benefit of Grantor and its successors and assigns.

This instrument is given by the CITY OF SEATTLE for the purpose of abandoning the Access Road Easement, the Permit for Groundwater Observation Well and the Monitoring Well aforesaid, and releasing and conveying its rights and interests thereto to Grantees, and is given for and in consideration of Grantees' acceptance of the terms and conditions set forth herein.

1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to the City Light Department; declaring certain real property rights and improvements surplus to the City of Seattle's utility needs; and authorizing the release of an access easement and a permit for a groundwater observation well, and the conveyance of ownership of said groundwater well to James and Valerie Van Dyke in Pend Oreille County, Washington.

Summary: This legislation will declare as surplus and release an access easement and a permit to install a groundwater monitoring well, and transfer ownership of the groundwater well to the property owners, James and Valerie Van Dyke, in Pend Oreille County, Washington.

Background: Seattle City Light installed more than 40 ground water level monitoring wells in Pend Oreille County as part of the Boundary Dam licensing process in the 1950s and 1960s. The purpose of these wells was to study the dam reservoir's impact on ground water levels and the potential, if any, to flood local mines.

Information from these monitoring wells was collected for nearly 50 years and indicated no deleterious ground water level effects, and the monitoring wells are no longer needed. City Light is in the process of closing and decommissioning these wells. Any groundwater monitoring well which is unusable, abandoned, whose use has been permanently discontinued, or is in disrepair must be properly decommissioned as required by WAC 173-160-381.

James and Valerie Van Dyke requested that the monitoring well on their property (Groundwater Observation Well No CS-36) not be decommissioned and instead that the well be conveyed to them and agreed to take responsibility for any liabilities and regulatory responsibilities related to this well.

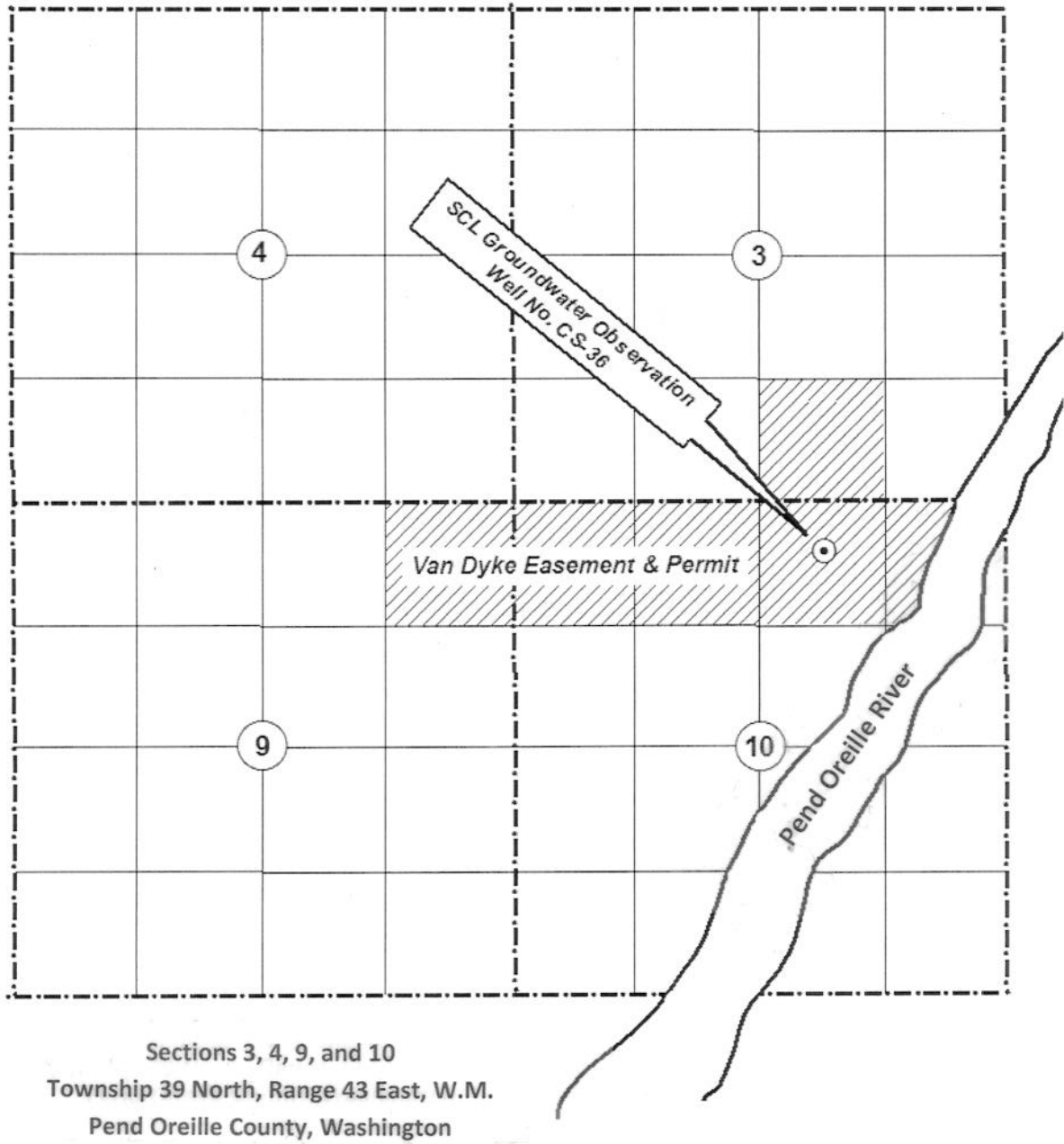

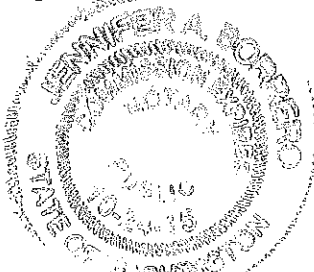
