COUNCIL BILL 118489

AN ORDINANCE relating to King County Conservation Futures Levy proceeds; authorizing the Mayor to amend the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the City of Seattle and King County authorized by City of Seattle Ordinance 114978; and authorizing the deposit of 2015 allocations from King County Conservation Futures Levy proceeds into the City of Seattle's 2008 Parks Levy Fund.

WHEREAS, in 1989, King County Ordinance 9128 established the Conservation Futures Levy (CFL) Fund, appropriated CFL proceeds to the City of Seattle (City), and established conditions for use of the proceeds, including allowable projects, costs, and expenses; and

WHEREAS, in 1990, City Ordinance 114978 authorized the CFL Interlocal Cooperation Agreement (CFL Interlocal) with King County to govern the receipt and use of CFL proceeds, and to define the specific projects (Projects) approved by King County for acquisition using CFL proceeds; and

WHEREAS, the City and King County have previously amended the CFL Interlocal to add additional Projects and to provide for additional allocations of CFL proceeds; and

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2014, the King County Council passed Ordinance 17941, which appropriated a total of \$1,775,000 in CFL proceeds to the City of Seattle for the Dakota Place Park Addition, Greenwood Park Addition, Kubota Garden Greenspace Addition, La Villa Meadows Natural Area / Thornton Creek and Morgan Junction Park Addition acquisition Projects; and

WHEREAS, On April 20, 2015, the King County Council passed Ordinance 18023, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into interlocal agreements with the City of Seattle

and the suburban cities for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds in Ordinance
17941; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor, or the Mayor's designee, is hereby authorized to negotiate and enter into an amendment to the Conservation Futures Levy (CFL) Interlocal Cooperation Agreement (Interlocal), substantially in the form of Exhibit A (Amendment), to provide for the City's receipt and use of up to \$1,775,000 from the 2015 allocations of King County CFL proceeds. The Amendment adds an Attachment AD to the list of approved projects (Projects) in the CFL Interlocal to include the Dakota Place Park Addition, Greenwood Park Addition, Kubota Garden Greenspace Addition, La Villa Meadows Natural Area / Thornton Creek, and Morgan Junction Park Addition acquisition Projects.

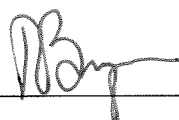
Section 2. Funds received pursuant to the Amendment shall be deposited as follows:

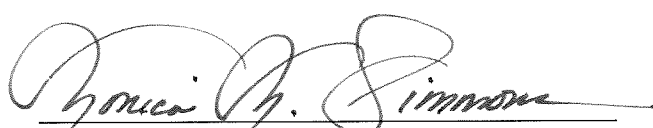

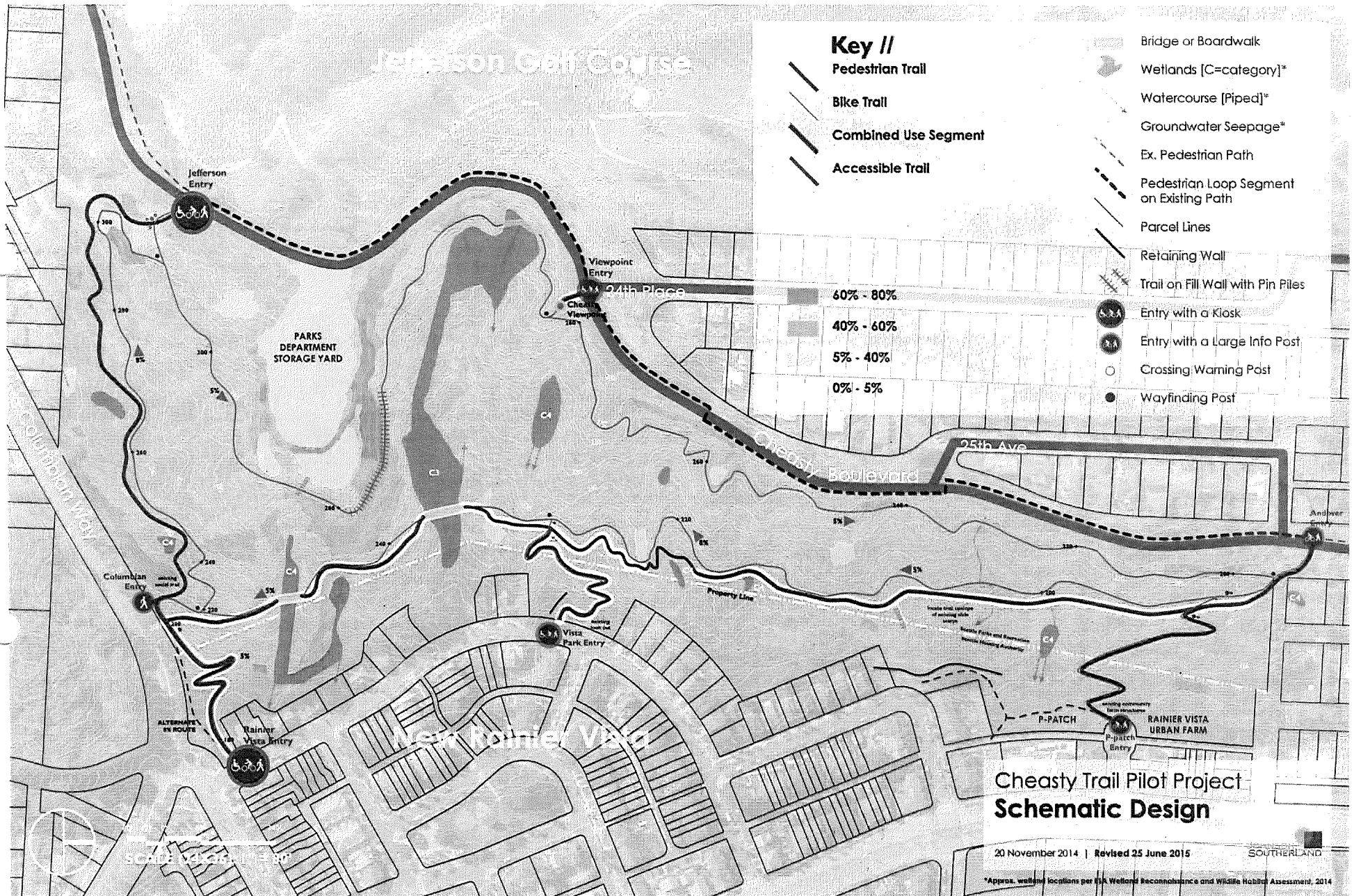

**AMENDMENT TO THE CONSERVATION FUTURES
INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN KING COUNTY AND THE CITY OF SEATTLE
FOR OPEN SPACE ACQUISITION PROJECTS**

Preamble

The King County Council, through Ordinance 9128, has established a Conservation Futures Levy Fund and appropriated proceeds to King County, the City of Seattle, and certain suburban cities through the procedures set forth in Ordinance 8867, as amended by Ordinance 14714. This Amendment is entered into to provide for the allocation of additional funds made available for open space acquisition.

THIS AMENDMENT is entered into between the CITY OF SEATTLE and KING COUNTY, and amends and attaches to and is part thereof of the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement (ILA), entered into between the parties on the 5th day of June, 1990, as previously amended.

The parties agree to the following amendments:

Amendment 1: Article 1. Recitals

The following paragraphs are hereby added to the Recitals Section to provide for a Conservation Futures Levy Fund allocation for the Dakota Place Park Addition, Greenwood Park Addition, Kubota Gardens Greenspace Addition, La Villa Meadows Natural Area and Morgan Junction Park Addition acquisition Projects, and hereafter read:

- On November 17, 2014, the King County Council passed Ordinance 17941, which allocated One Million, Seven Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$1,775,000) in CFL proceeds to the City for the Dakota Place Park Addition, Greenwood Park Addition, Kubota Gardens Greenspace Addition, La Villa Meadows Natural Area and Morgan Junction Park Addition acquisition Projects. On April 20, 2015 the King County Council passed Ordinance 18023, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into interlocal agreements with the City for the disbursement of CFL proceeds as provided in Ordinance 17941.

Amendment 2: Article V. Conditions of Agreement

Section 5.1 is amended to include Attachment AD, which lists 2015 Conservation Futures Levy allocations for the Dakota Place Park Addition, Greenwood Park Addition, Kubota Gardens Greenspace Addition, La Villa Meadows Natural Area and Morgan Junction Park Addition acquisition Projects.

Amendment 3: Article VII. Responsibilities of County

The first two sentences of this article are amended to include Attachment AD, which lists 2015 Conservation Futures Levy proceeds allocations for the Dakota Place Park Addition, Greenwood Park Addition, Kubota Gardens Greenspace Addition, La Villa Meadows Natural Area and Morgan Junction Park Addition acquisition Projects:

Subject to the terms of this agreement, the County will provide Conservation Futures Levy Funds in the amounts shown in Attachments A through AD to be used for the Projects listed in Attachments A through AD. The City may request additional funds; however, the County has no obligation to provide funds to the City for the Projects in excess of the total amounts shown in Attachments A through AD. The County assumes no obligation for the future support of the Projects described herein, except as expressly set forth in this agreement.

Amendment 4: Attachment AD

The attachments to the interlocal agreement are hereby amended to include references to Attachment AD, which is hereby attached to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement, incorporated therein, and made a part thereof.

In all other respects, the terms, conditions, duties, and obligations of both parties shall remain the same as agreed to in the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement as previously amended.

This document shall be attached to the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement.

Project Descriptions:

(From Ordinance 18023):

1123822 Seattle – Dakota Place Park Addition

The goal of this new project is to acquire a .13-acre property located immediately to the north of Dakota Place Park in Seattle. It is on the west side of California Avenue SW in the West Seattle Junction Urban Village.

1123823 Seattle – Greenwood Park Addition

This new project will acquire one of two inholding parcels in Greenwood Park, located on Fremont Avenue North at North 88th Street in the Greenwood neighborhood of Seattle. The property contains a small house that will be removed.

1116259 Seattle – Kubota Gardens Greenspace Addition

This new project will acquire up to 7.16 acres of wooded open space adjacent to the Kubota Garden Greenspace. The project will help buffer the garden from encroaching development that would significantly diminish the experience of visiting the garden.

1123824 Seattle – La Villa Meadows Natural Area / Thornton Creek

This new project, the La Villa Meadows Natural Area on Thornton Creek acquisition project, will add a .39-acre inholding to the Thornton Creek natural Area. It currently contains a house that will be removed. The property is located on Thornton Creek, east of Lake City Way and north of NE 100th Street.

1116253 Seattle – Morgan Junction Park Addition

This project will acquire .28 acre property to expand Morgan Junction Park in West Seattle. It is located on California Avenue SW at SW Eddy Street.

2015: \$700,000 is added to the Morgan Junction Park Addition CFT Project to help complete funding for acquisition of the property.

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to King County Conservation Futures Levy proceeds; authorizing the Mayor to amend the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the City of Seattle and King County authorized by City of Seattle Ordinance 114978; and authorizing the deposit of 2015 allocations from King County Conservation Futures Levy proceeds into the City of Seattle's 2008 Parks Levy Fund.

Summary and background of the Legislation:

This legislation authorizes the Mayor to amend the existing Conservation Futures Levy (CFL) Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the City of Seattle and King County. The amendment will add three new projects to the list of King County-approved acquisition projects (Dakota Place Park Addition, Greenwood Park Addition and La Villa Meadows Natural Area / Thornton Creek,) and provide additional funding to Morgan Junction Park Addition and Kubota Garden Greenspace Addition. A detailed description of the projects can be found in Attachment AD to the amended agreement.

The total amount of CFL funds provided by King is up to \$1,775,000. The projects being funded in this interlocal are listed below. The CFL funds will be used to partially reimburse the costs of each project.

- Dakota Place Park Addition (closed 4/3/2014)
- Greenwood Park Addition (closed 11/6/2013)
- Morgan Junction Park Addition (closed 6/30/2014)
- Kubota Garden Greenspace Addition (closed 5/1/2014)
- La Villa Meadows Natural Area / Thornton Creek (closed 6/30/2014)

The CFL is a county-wide property tax collected by King County for the acquisition of open space, agricultural or timber lands. From 1990 to 1997, King County allocated the CFL proceeds among incorporated and unincorporated areas, based on project applications by local governments, citizen groups and individual citizens. In 2001, the County re-established the application process for allocating the CFL proceeds. Among the requirements is the provision of at least a 50 percent matching contribution by the applicant. Ordinance 122749, which authorized the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy (2008 Parks Levy), anticipated that the costs of the projects might exceed actual levy revenues and provided authority to use 2008 Parks Levy funds to leverage outside funding sources to enhance these projects.

The CFL reimbursements will be deposited in the 2008 Parks Levy Fund (Fund 33860) and will provide reimbursement for the projects as follows:

- \$1,775,000 will reimburse prior acquisition costs for five projects Dakota Place Park Addition, Greenwood Park Addition, Kubota Garden Greenspace Addition, La Villa Meadows Natural Area / Thornton Creek, Morgan Junction Park Addition.

The following appropriation authority was previously legislated: Ordinance 12448 authorized appropriations for Dakota Place Park Addition (\$776,485); Ordinance 124321 authorized appropriations for Greenwood Park Addition (\$300,000); Ordinances 123363 (\$5,000,000) and 123442 (\$2,275,000) provided appropriation for Neighborhood Parks some of which was transferred to Morgan Junction Park Addition (\$3,441,514). Ordinance 122959 authorized expenditures for Kubota Garden Greenspace Addition (\$1,296,228) and La Villa Meadows Natural Area / Thornton Creek (\$628,133.33).

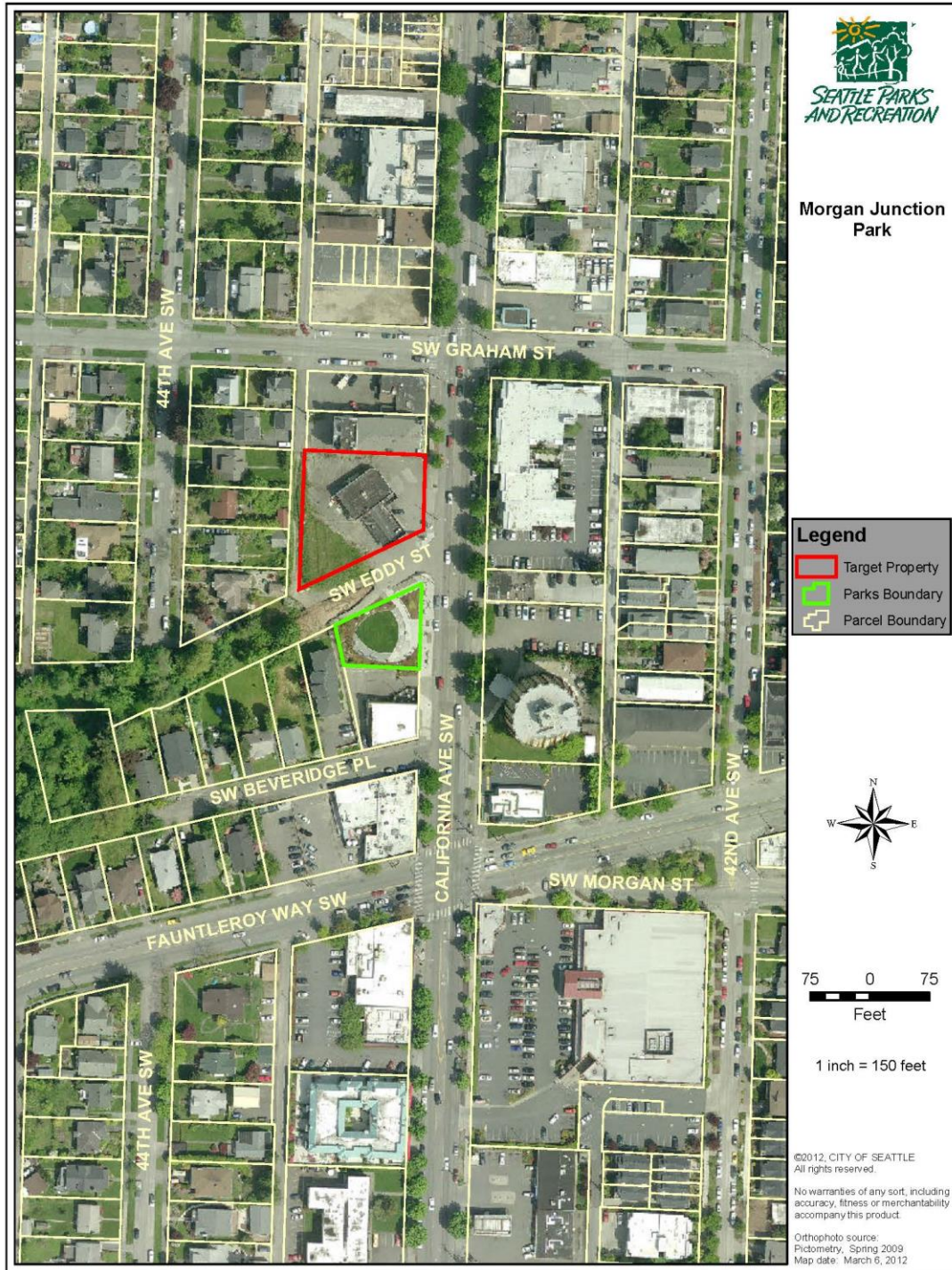

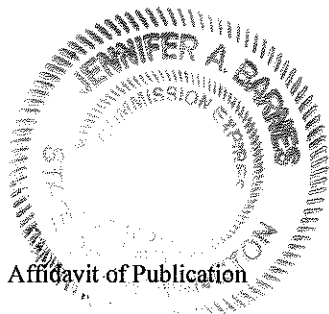
