COUNCIL BILL 119438

AN ORDINANCE appropriating money to pay certain audited claims and ordering the payment thereof.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Payment of the sum of \$37,411,789.35 on Summit mechanical warrants numbered 4100149739 – 4100151909 plus manual or cancellation issues for claims, E- Payables of \$72,516.98 on Summit 9100002306 – 9100002348 and Electronic Financial Transactions (EFT) in the amount of \$44,500,684.02 are presented for ratification by the City Council per Chapter RCW 42.24.180.

Section 2. Payment of the sum of \$48,053,631.37 on City General Salary Fund mechanical warrants numbered 51307623– 51308168 plus manual warrants, agencies warrants, and direct deposits numbered 10001 – 12730 representing Gross Payrolls for payroll ending date December 25, 2018 as detailed in the Payroll Summary Report for claims against the City which were audited by the Auditing Committee and reported by said committee to the City Council January 3, 2019 consistent with appropriations heretofore made for such purpose from the appropriate Funds, is hereby approved.

Section 3. Any act consistent with the authority of this ordinance taken prior to its effective date is hereby ratified and confirmed.

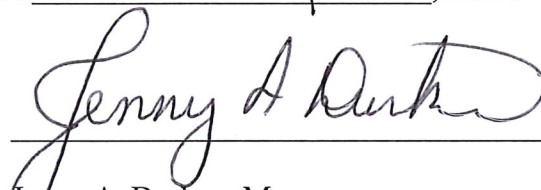
Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.

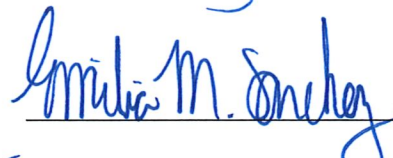

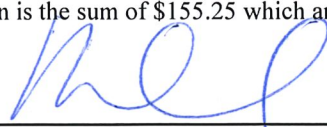

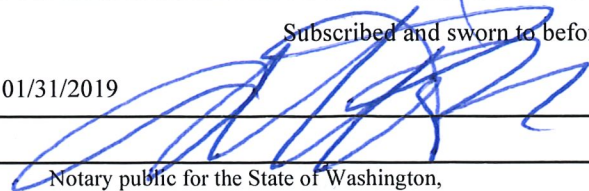

of Lot 1, Block 297, Plat of Seattle Tidelands; placing the real property rights and interests conveyed by such deeds under the jurisdiction of the Seattle Department of Transportation and laying them off as right-of-way; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.
