ORDINANCE 99363

AN ORDINANCE relating to the public peace, safety and welfare and making it unlawful to climb or be upon the "Wedgewood Rock."

WHEREAS, within the public street area at the intersection of Northeast 72nd Street and 28th Avenue Northeast there is a large rock or boulder commonly referred to and known as the "Wedgewood Rock"; and

WHEREAS, said "Wedgewood Rock" is approximately eighteen feet in height and has vertical faces to a height of approximately twelve feet; and

WHEREAS, persons climbing on said "Wedgewood Rock" have by reason thereof created disturbances and have destroyed, damaged and mutilated trees and shrubs growing in and upon said public street area; and

WHEREAS, climbing on said "Wedgewood Rock" is hazardous and threatens serious bodily injury to persons attempting so to do; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. (a) It is unlawful for anyone to climb or be upon that certain rock or boulder known as the "Wedgewood Rock" located within the public street area at the intersection of Northeast 72nd Street and 28th Avenue Northeast.

(b) Anyone convicted of a violation of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section ²..... This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.


Honorable Members:
