RESOLUTION 31591

A RESOLUTION recognizing the Vietnamese Heritage and Freedom flag as the symbol for Seattle's Vietnamese community.

WHEREAS, the Vietnamese Heritage and Freedom Flag consists of a yellow field with three horizontal red stripes in the middle and was the flag of former South Vietnam; and

WHEREAS, Seattle is home to more than 10,000 Vietnamese Americans, the second largest foreign-born immigrant community in Seattle, and the state of Washington is home to more than 70,000 Vietnamese Americans; and

WHEREAS, April 30, 2015 marked the 40th Anniversary of the end of the Vietnam War; and

WHEREAS, many Vietnamese allies fled after the United States left Vietnam on April 30, 1975, and former Governor Dan Evans and the great people of the state of Washington welcomed and aided thousands of Vietnamese refugees; and

WHEREAS, these refugees lost their homes and their home country and had no place to go because they faced persecution for fighting alongside the United States in pursuit of freedom and the liberties valued by the United States; and

WHEREAS, the first refugees arrived at Camp Murray near Fort Lewis; and

WHEREAS, the state of Washington helped fund the first Vietnamese-language newspaper in the country called Dat Moi meaning "new land," providing valuable information to refugees; and

1 WHEREAS, although the majority of Vietnamese immigrants were located in underdeveloped
2 urban neighborhoods, they nevertheless established strong vibrant communities in a short
3 period of time, rebuilding their lives and becoming proud American citizens; and

4 WHEREAS; in the United States, approximately 13 state governments, seven counties, and 85
5 cities have adopted resolutions to recognize the Vietnamese Heritage and Freedom Flag;
6 and

7 WHEREAS, the City of Seattle passed Resolution 24896, 24900, and 24913 from April 21, 1975
8 to May 12, 1975, welcoming Vietnamese refugees to Seattle and instructing City
9 agencies to cooperate with private and federal agencies in helping refugees; and

10 WHEREAS, the history, arts, economy, food, and culture of the City of Seattle have been
11 significantly influenced by local Vietnamese Americans whose customs and traditions are
12 respected and celebrated; and

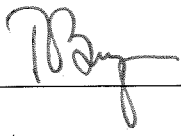
13 WHEREAS, the business district that is Seattle's Little Saigon has been the economic and social
14 center of the Vietnamese community since the 1980s; and

15 WHEREAS, the overwhelming consensus of Seattle's Vietnamese population is that the
16 Vietnamese Heritage and Freedom flag is a unifying symbol of a vibrant, energetic,
17 engaged, and prosperous future for the Vietnamese community in Seattle; NOW,
18 THEREFORE,

19 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE, THE**
20 **MAYOR CONCURRING, THAT:**

21 Section 1. The City of Seattle honors its local Vietnamese community's history,
22 contributions, and achievements and recognizes the Vietnamese Heritage and Freedom
23 Flag as the symbol for the Vietnamese community in Seattle.

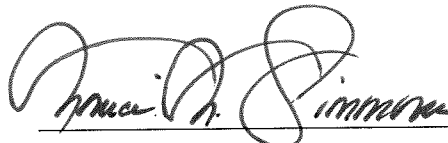

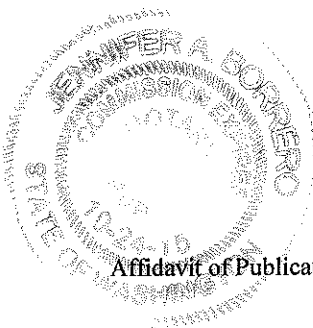
