A RESOLUTION relating to the Equitable Development Implementation Plan and Equitable Development Financial Investment Strategy; voicing support for certain community-initiated projects contained in the Plan and identifying next steps for implementation of those projects.

WHEREAS, Race and Social Equity is one of the core value of Seattle 2035, Seattle's

Comprehensive Plan for growth over the next 20 years; and

WHEREAS, in order to identify key steps in implementing that core value the City Council

passed 2016 Statement of Legislative Intent 32-2-A-1 asking the Executive to prepare an equitable development implementation strategy for Seattle 2035; and

WHEREAS, the Office of Planning and Community Development and the Seattle Office for

Civil Rights have worked closely with communities in the Central District,

Chinatown/International District, and Rainier Valley to identify strategies to mitigate the impacts of growth on marginalized communities; and

WHEREAS, those communities have come together to identify specific projects that build on

community assets to support jobs and economic development for marginalized community members; and

WHEREAS, implementing those projects can increase stability, cohesion, and affordability in

communities that face a high risk of displacement; and

WHEREAS, the City Council seeks to endorse that work and to identify next steps to move those

projects forward; NOW, THEREFORE,

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE THAT:**

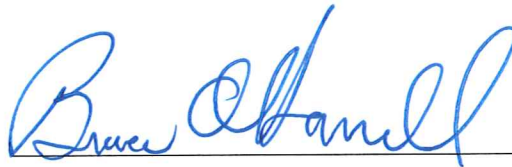
1 Section 1. The Equitable Development Implementation Plan contained in Clerk File  
2 319789 and the Equitable Development Financial Investment Strategy contained in Clerk File  
3 319828 identify the following six community-initiated equitable development projects as  
4 priorities for mitigating further displacement and increasing access to opportunity in the Central  
5 Area, the Chinatown/International District and South Seattle:

- 6 a. The Multicultural Community Center;
- 7 b. The Rainier Beach Innovation District;
- 8 c. The Southeast Economic Opportunity Center;
- 9 d. The William Grose Center for Cultural Innovation;
- 10 e. The Little Saigon Landmark Project; and
- 11 f. The Equity Transfer of Development Rights (TDR) for Affordable Commercial Space  
12 strategy.

13 Section 2. The Council voices its support for the projects listed in Section 1 of this  
14 resolution and asks the Office of Planning and Community Development to work with the City  
15 Budget Office and the community sponsors of the projects listed in Section 1 of this resolution to  
16 continue to develop and identify resources to fully implement the projects, including City  
17 financial support for organizations sponsoring the projects listed above and a possible Equitable  
18 Development Implementation Fund. The Council acknowledges that a number of different  
19 funding sources will be required to implement these plans, but recognizes the City's key role as a  
20 funder, convener, and supporter of the projects. The Council asks the Office of Planning and  
21 Community Development to report annually on progress towards implementing the projects  
22 listed above.

Section 3. The Council also recognizes that additional work needs to be done to create the equitable city that the plan envisions. The Council requests that the Office of Planning and Community Development begin work with additional communities faced with a high risk of displacement and low access to opportunity to identify whether there are community-led strategies or projects that can support jobs and economic development and reduce the threat of displacement in those communities.

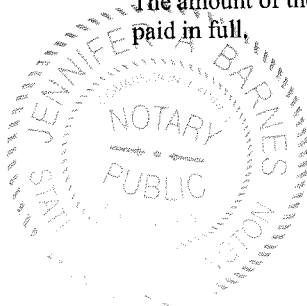

### **Res 31696 Adopted (9 - 0)**

A RESOLUTION expressing the need to accelerate the transition of the City's transportation sector away from oil and increase the use of electricity for transportation by adopting a goal to cut oil use for transportation by half by 2035; endorsing the Mayor's Drive Clean Seattle initiative; setting a goal that 30 percent of vehicles in the City will be electric by 2030; and establishing requirements for the Executive to report on initial actions to support these goals.

### **Res 31700 Adopted (9 - 0)**

A RESOLUTION granting conceptual approval to Swedish Health Services to construct and maintain a pedestrian tunnel under and across Minor Avenue, south of Columbia Street and north of Cherry Street.

### **Res 31705**

A RESOLUTION related to addressing the needs of people living in the I-5 East Duwamish Greenbelt and in the adjoining neighborhoods; accepting the Seattle Human Services Department's East Duwamish Greenbelt Encampments Outreach Assessment; and approving the City's operations plan to physically improve and maintain the Greenbelt and provide a healthier and safer environment for all.

### **Res 31706 Adopted (9 - 0)**

A RESOLUTION approving the Seattle Freight Master Plan.

### **Res 31710 Adopted (9 - 0)**

A RESOLUTION recognizing the extensive effort of the Rainier Beach neighborhood to update its vision and plan for the future of the neighborhood; to advance neighborhood priorities through the completion of the "Rainier Beach Neighborhood Plan Update," a combined effort of the community and the City, that informs City policies, programs, and investments for those areas included in the Rainier Beach Neighborhood Plan Update.
